Action step from today's sermon:

Identify a person in your life in whom you can "deposit" a legacy of faith. Then take the next step toward doing this. Pray for God to help you to not be held back by any risk involved in doing this (possible resistance, time commitment, etc.).

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QUICK REVIEW

1. Mark referred to the word Kairos in his message. How did Pastor Mark define this term?
2. According to Pastor Mark, how does leaving a legacy relate to Kairos moments? When Kairos moments arise in our lives how should we approach them?

MY STORY

1. History is full of examples of people who seized the moment and did something amazing with an opportunity that they faced. Offer a few historic examples and discuss their impact on society.
2. Have you ever experienced a unique opportunity in your life but for whatever reason you decided not to act or respond? What was the reason you had for not seizing the opportunity? Would you do it all over if you could? How do you think your life would have been different if you had acted or responded to that opportunity?

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DIGGING DEEPER

1. Read 2 Timothy 3:10-4:15. In this passage, Paul encourages Timothy to leave a legacy of faith. In what ways does Paul encourage Timothy to live and lead as a minister of the Gospel? How might Paul's counsel to Timothy help equip you when you face special Kairos moments in your own life?
2. Read Judges 16. To add a little creative flare to your group, select a few readers to read portions related to the characters in the story (narrator, Samson, Delilah, "the group", etc.) In what ways did Samson fail to walk through meaningful moments in his life? In what ways did he demonstrate his ability to seize the moment? Is Samson someone you can relate to, why or why not?
3. How is Luke 14:25-27 connected to leaving a legacy as a follower of Christ? Discuss the meaning and difficulty of applying Luke 14:25-27 to our lives.
