What are several practical steps you could take to grow spiritually based on what you heard from the sermon?


Disciples of Jesus are children of God, which is to be evident in our parenting.

Read Ephesians 6:1-4.

- Read Ephesians 6:1-4. See also Colossians 3:20-21; Exodus. 20: 12; Deuteronomy 5:16. Summarize the teaching and central message of these passages. In what ways does honoring/obeying relate to living a long life? What do the authors mean in making this statement? Looking at these verses, what connection is there, if any, between obeying parents and obeying God?
- What does it look like practically to honor/obey our parents? Is there a difference between honoring and obeying? Does honoring and obeying our parents look different as we age and move through the seasons of life? If yes, what changes and what does not change in terms of honoring/obeying our parents?
- As a child of the parents (or a parent) who parented and raised you, do you feel content with the honor you have shown to them? What would you like to change or do differently as you look back at the past and think about your relationship today? Would your parents say they felt honored by you?
- How does being a child of God help inform the relationship between parent and child? In other words, as we think about our relationship with God the Father what transferable aspects of our relationship with God apply to the parent/child relationship?
- In emphasizing these passages, we often downplay or minimize the commands aimed at parents, specifically the father. What instruction is given to the parents? What does it look like practically to live out what is commanded of parents?
- How would you teach these verses to a young follower of Jesus? What would you say to the child who has an unhealthy relationship with dysfunctional parents? What comfort or encouragement would you give them as you instruct them to honor and obey their parents?
